Israel is expected to be attacked by proxies of the Iranian Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC), operating under the Al-Quds Brigade (Quds), **from April 12-15**th, **however a precautionary window of April 12-17**th **is given.**

NOTE: THE ATTACKS ARE PRIMARILY EXPECTED WITHIN 24-48 HOURS; THE TIME FRAME ABOVE IS A RANGE

The attack will center on the **coordinated employment of Suicide Drones (SDs; i.e loitering munitions)**, **Cruise Missiles (CMs), and Ballistic Missiles (BMs)**. They would be launched primarily by the following groups:

- Hezbollah:
 - Hezbollah operatives in Lebanon and Syria are expected to open the assault, firstly with large volleys of short-range unguided rockets (general area bombardment, GAB) targeting Intelligence, Reconnaissance, and Surveillance (ISR), and radar suites in Northern Israel.
 - Air Defense (AD) batteries and Israel Defense Force (IDF) bases in the Golan Heights are expected to be targeted via general area bombardment. These are expected to include Shebaa Farms, Ramya, Machne Yarden, Camp Filon, Camp Yitzhak, Mount Avital.
 - Individual sensors of vital importance in the border area will be targeted with ATGMs, sniper fire, and small SDs.
 - Immediately following short-range general area bombardment, long range GAB would begin saturation fires across Northern Israel. SDs are expected to target ISR, radar, and AD targets deeper inside Israel as those closer to Lebanon are destroyed.
- Militias allied under the Popular Mobilization Forces (PMF):
 - SDs and CMs would be launched as Hezbollah commences long-range GAB. Munitions would be launched from Iraq and Syria over Syria but primarily Jordan. This will decrease likelihood of interception as Israeli air defense is oriented towards threats from Syria.
 - Firstly, SDs are expected to target (ISR) and AD batteries in the first wave.
 - The second wave would likely continue to target ISR and AD sites alongside IDF positions in North-Eastern Israel with CMs and SDs, progressing towards intelligence and military facilities as primary targets are destroyed.
 - The third wave will likely focus on BM strikes against military, intelligence, and government facilities deeper inside Israel.
- The Houthis:
 - The Houthis are expected to time their first wave, consisting of SDs and CMs, with the first PMF strike. Munitions will be launched prior to account for flight time. They will target primarily sensor and AD sites in South-Eastern and Southern Israel.
 - The second strike will be dominated by CMs and BMs, striking intelligence, and military facilities.
- IRGC:
 - The IRGC is not expected to launch munitions from Iranian soil however it is a possibility. IRGC operatives would heavily assist proxies with targeting and launching munitions, if not launch them themselves.

- Prior to launches by the IRGC, or its proxies, significant Electronic Warfare (EW) operations are to be expected. This will likely occur even if the IRGC does not launch munitions from its territory.
 - These attacks would primarily be executed via ship, drone, and missile-based transmitters.
 - EW actions would be focused on 5th Fleet vessels in the Arabian Gulf and landbased sensors in:
 - Fujairah Naval Base (Oman; land, air, naval EW)
 - Al Dhafra and Al Udeid Air Bases (UAE; air, naval EW)
 - Shaikh Isa Air Base (KSA; naval EW)
 - Ali Al Salem Air Base and Camp Buehring (Kuwait; naval, air EW)
 - Camp Lemonnier (Djibouti; naval EW)
 - Al-Asad, Erbil, and Airbases (Iraq; land, naval, aerial EW)
- If munitions are launched from Iranian soil, they will likely be centered on deploying decoys, chaff, and Electronic-Warfare means over Israel prior to Hezbollah's first strike.
- The second wave would likely center on Iran's most advanced CMs, targeting key sensor and AD sites, with munitions launched prior to those of the groups above for simultaneous impact and accounting for flight time.
- The third wave would likely see a very large number of BMs striking military and intelligence targets across Israel.
